We did a 6-hr Workshop-training for area pastors/leaders = stepping through our ReadyIndy(.org) protocols for immediate response phase in slo-mo, teaching along the way. Point was to demonstrate a capability of going from chaos to order. Then we did a 2-hr functional exercise to simulate it in real-time, measuring our results per objective. This is our second annual exercise, measuring the same objectives, so we can mark progress in citywide communication among the Christian community... and quality measure of readiness.

(Nuances & Injects: Because of the death of a local IMPD officer in the line of duty, we deferred our first hour of the scheduled exercise to collaborate re a prayer-vigil for the family and the community of police officers. Thus our actual exercise time available was only 1 actual hour. Further, our simulation included a 50% outage of infrastructure, including available phone-lines & towers. Thus we restricted ourselves to only texting and social-media communications... and only measured alerts that were received and confirmed. Imagine the obstacle that creates: What churches publish a textable emergency number? None. Also, for the first time we included 5 @ReadyVOST participants (Virtual Ops Support Team).

Objective#1 = demonstrate an area EOC, focused on citywide communication among Christian community & secular affiliates. Reached/confirmed 22 churches via texting/social-media only. Total people reached/confirmed via texting/socialmedia (incl the 22) = 160. Total 'capabilities' among those people = 219. (symbolically measured as number of readiness training certificates possessed)

Objective#2 = simulate a church P.O.D. setup. Result: 13 people participated in this segment of the objective.

There's great value in being able to objectively measure progress, both with a Quantity metric (160 people) and with a Quality metric (219 capabilities)... especially as we can readily see the great progress over last year, despite exercise time cut in half, and voice-phone restriction.

One unintended consequence was our timely presence at the prayer vigil for the fallen officer & family... and being "ready" for prayer, care and share. As a result, 16 neighbors responded with a greater commitment to the Christian walk, modeled for us by our Savior "coming into our emergency and sacrificially giving His life on our behalf, and then asking us to do likewise: Love the Lord and love your neighbor as yourself." What mayor or sheriff wouldn't want that in their community?
